# Call for Posters

### Poster session at the DLA Annual Conference 2025

At the upcoming Daylight Academy (DLA) Annual Conference, early-career researchers (PhD students and postdoctoral researchers) will have the opportunity to present their own projects on posters and receive valuable feedback from experts.

We invite contributions from all fields and perspectives. The topic has to be related to daylight research and be relevant to the theme of the conference (see below).

Posters will be displayed in the lunch and coffee break area throughout the two days of the conference and presented during a session of flash talks.

### **Submissions**

Submissions must include the title of the contribution, the names and affiliations of the authors, the abstract and 3-5 keywords. They can be sent to office@daylight.academy until **1 March 2025**.

Following a competitive review, selected candidates will be invited to the entire conference and their accommodation and travel costs (at economy rate) will be covered by the DLA.

## Information about the conference

With the theme *Daylight Matters - Turning Knowledge into Change*, this year's DLA Annual Conference aims to explore how scientific knowledge about daylight can be translated into meaningful action.

Together, participants will identify key messages, target audiences, and effective communication activities to address knowledge-action gaps. Where is there a lack of evidence? Where do we already have sufficient knowledge, but it fails to reach the right audiences or drive change? Join us in developing strategies for integrating daylight into practices that benefit humans and nature. The role of transdisciplinary research in bridging disciplines and involving stakeholders will remain a central theme.

The conference will take place on 22-23 May 2025 at the Institute for Advanced Study of the Technical University Munich (TUM-IAS) and will also be co-hosted by the TUM.
